Synopsis

On December 2, 2007, § 87(2)(b) had a domestic dispute with his daughter, § 87(2)(b). His other daughter, § 87(2)(b) called 911. PO Schwartz (name and number obtained from shield) said, “Whoever called 911 is dumb” (**Allegation A**). PO Schwartz told § 87(2)(b) that if he and his daughter were to have another altercation, PO Schwartz would arrest them both (**Allegation B**).

On December 6, 2007, the undersigned spoke with § 87(2)(b). It was explained to § 87(2)(b) that the investigation could not proceed without his sworn testimony, but § 87(2)(b) stated that he could not give a sworn statement because he was too busy with the family court proceedings. § 87(2)(b) said he would not be available until “after January” and asked the undersigned to call him later. On December 10, 2007, the undersigned spoke with § 87(2)(b) again. It was explained to § 87(2)(b) that the investigation could not wait until “after January” and that, therefore, the case would be closed. § 87(2)(b) did not object but did not wish to withdraw his complaint. It was explained to § 87(2)(b) that if he were to want to re-open his case, he could petition the board. § 87(2)(g)
