### CCRB Testimony

On October 7, 2015, was interviewed at the CCRB. On September 19, 2015, at approximately 4:31 a.m., was driving in the car with her aunt, and to drop them off. They had previously been out celebrating and her cousins. birthday at a hookah lounge. and her aunt needed to use the bathroom. In her rush to urinate, ran a red light. To knowledge, her vehicle was in good working order and running the red light was the only traffic infraction she committed. had previously had 1/2 cup of cranberry juice and Hennessy, but stated this was hours prior, when it had still be daylight outside at around 2:00 p.m. was not sure at what intersection she ran the red light, but stated it was whatever intersection was listed on the police documents. Approximately two seconds after ran the red light, she pulled over and stopped the door. opened the door so that they could get out and urinate. As and her aunt was getting out of her car, she looked to the left and saw four police officers, PO1-PO4. The officers did not use sirens or lights and did not notice them until she looked over and saw them. The officers asked "Did you realize you almost killed us?" replied that she did not, but she knew she had run the light because she needed to use the bathroom. continued talking with the officers for approximately 10 minutes, she did not remember how they replied to her. Sometime during this time, and her Aunt urinated. noted that her aunt urinated before her. One of the officers, PO1, gave a breathalyzer test. The breathalyzer test was negative.

While was speaking with the officers, her Aunt and began arguing amongst could not recall what they were arguing about. themselves. was considered about getting into trouble and knew that yelling in front of the police could only lead to one thing, so she smacked on the back of the head. then hit back. One of the officers, PO2, then told she needed to calm down because she was yelling at that she needed to calm down. PO2 then handcuffed and dragged her by her wrists to a marked four door police car. After PO2 handcuffed she asked him, "What the fuck are you doing? What did I do? For what?" PO2 replied to "Calm down, get in the backseat, vou'll be alright, faggot." did not say anything in response to this. had earlier described herself as being dragged, but later stated that she walked to the car. could not remember where in relation to her car the police car was parked or if it was the car the officers had originally been in. At certain point during the incident, additional officers arrived; estimated that it was no more than eight in addition to the four that she had originally seen. also believed there was a "paddy wagon" on scene. PO2 placed in the backseat of the car and got into the backseat with her. When was originally placed in the car with PO2, the car was stationary. PO2 called a "stupid black bitch." PO2 this a few times, also calling her a "dirty black bitch." PO2 then punched called in the face. started yelling for her aunt, saying, "What the fuck is wrong with you? What are you doing to me? Help!" Her aunt could not hear her. Two other officers, PO3 and PO4, also got into the car, in the front seats. could not see what these officers looked like, but believed one was a tall white male and one may have been PO1. She thought the tall white male was in the driver's seat. The officers tried to pull PO2 off of called the officers "faggots." PO2 stopped hitting her when the other officers got into the car, but once the officers began driving the car, PO2 resumed hitting As the car pulled off. heard her aunt with his left hand and dragged her calling out and saying, "What are you doing to her!" PO2 grabbed head down onto his legs. With his left hand, open palm, he was grabbing around the back of neck and noted that PO2 had very large hands and with his hand wrapped around her neck, it reached choking her. towards the front her neck. With his other hand, he continued punching her in face. was not sure how long this went on for; she noted that to her it felt like it was going on forever. estimated that PO2

punched her in the face a total of eight to ten times, all of the punches were to her face and eye. After the sixth hit, bit PO2 on his wrist, she could not recall which wrist she bit. PO2 started screaming at her, "Oh you stupid black bitch, you stupid black bitch, you like this, you like this." continued biting his wrist and would not let go of it. She got his blood in her mouth. stated that she has OCD so she knew not swallow the blood. PO3 and PO4 tried to drag off of PO2 and she was dragged out of the car. believed she was dragged out of the police car at the precinct and was then placed into an ambulance that was already out of the car, other officers helped him but there. PO2 dragged could not see out of her eyes so could not see any of them. She noted that all the actions were a group effort, not performed by any singular officer. Shackles were placed on legs; her feet were cut up as a result of the shackles. They threw onto a bed inside of the ambulance; she did not recall ever being placed on a stretcher.

believed the EMS workers were black because she "knows black voices." The EMS workers called her an "ugly bitch." The EMS workers wrapped her in a blanket. Kept spinning around in the blanket, she estimated she did seven 360 turns. She thought it took about twelve people, a combination of EMS and police officers, to get her to stop. They were also trying to get the spit mask on her, but were unable to. Hospital. Once at the hospital, people kept sticking her with needles and spit on many of the nurses, spitting the blood that was in her mouth on them.

gave her hot packs for her eye. Initially stated that she did not know if an officer stayed with her while she was at the hospital, but then stated that there was "one cool officer" who stayed with her. She did not know what he looked like or what his name is. Determined the believed she was at the hospital until the next day.

was upset because at a certain point her wig was taken from her, which led her to feel ugly and be called names by other inmates, including being called "Mr.," "Sir," "Man," and "Fucked up, yo boy, you see her." While at the precinct stationhouse, which had to deal with racial slurs from the other inmates, in particular a Russian male told her that he was going to come to her house and "fuck her grandmother." Since the incident, has become jumpy every time she hears sirens. She likes to listen to trap music which has a lot of sirens in it and makes her jump, she is incredibly paranoid, she wants to beat everybody up, she has to see a psychiatrist and therapist, and has to go to anger management. As a result of the incident, when she drives and stated that her eve will never be the same.

On October 21, 2015, was interviewed inside of On September 19, 2015, at approximately 4:31 a.m., was in the car with her cousin, her mother, and her sister, They had just left a birthday party for had to use the bathroom very badly and due to this urgency, ran a red light. did knowledge, not know at what intersection they ran the red light. To car was in good working order, they were driving the speed limit, and running the red light was the only traffic violation she made. Neither had been drinking that night. nor

After running the red light, they made the next immediate left, driving for approximately one block, going into the block so that could use a tree to urinate. stated that they were aware the officers were following them, the officers had lights and sirens engaged. By the time that the officers' car pulled up behind car, had already exited the vehicle, she was standing on the driver's side of the car, by the back explained that she thought passenger's door. was also outside of the car; was worried about her backseat because it is fabric. Three officers, PO1-PO3, got out of their vehicle and approached them. One of the officers, PO1, told her, "You need to get the fuck back in the car." explained to PO1 that her mother was in the backseat, was a little older, and needed to use the bathroom so all they wanted to do was use a tree. PO1 again told that she needed to get back in the car and she again explained the bathroom described the officers as making fun of the situation a little, so she believed everything was situation. also began speaking with the officers, identifying herself as the driver and explaining that she okay. wanted to check on her aunt. The officers went over to where was standing, on the driver's side of the explained that at first her mother vehicle in front of the driver's door. got of the car as well, was a little afraid, but then got out for a little. believed that PO1, upon seeing who is in her 50s, calmed down a little and understood the situation. was then not feeling well and got back inside the never exited the vehicle. car, where she remained inside. The officers asked for license, explained that only had the temporary

license card because her wallet had been stolen a couple days before. The officers took problem with the temporary where they had been coming from, what they had been doing, and PO2 license. The officers were asking a breathalyzer test three times, which was negative each time. During the breathalyzer test, PO2 gave also looked in the car with his flashlight, checking to see if there was alcohol in the car. PO2 commented to them that they did not look intoxicated and did not smell alcohol on them. estimated that this entire interaction, the talking and the breathalyzer went on for five to seven minutes. PO1 told them that they just needed to confirm license, and would then release them. Two of the officers wished a happy birthday and apologized for the inconvenience and told the girls that everything seemed to be fine. offered to give the social security card as an extra form of ID. The officer told them that they could not run that, officers but they could all come to the precinct, where they would run it to confirm was who she said she was.

and then they could all go home.

Approximately five minutes after the incident began, a second police car pulled up at the location. There were about three to four officers in this car. These officers got out of their car and looked around, then got back into their car and left before the incident concluded.

While was giving the officers the social security card, she and was a began to bicker amongst themselves. They were arguing because whether arguing for approximately two minutes. They were standing close to each other during this time, each in front of their respective doors. The argument was only verbal; they were yelling at each other, but there was no physical contact between the two of them. We believed the officers may have thought that the fight was going to get physical, because PO2 then pinned was a gainst the

car, turning her around by her shoulders, with her face against the car. slipped down from his grasp and turned her body around, facing forward and told PO2 that she had not done anything wrong and to not place her hands behind her back. PO2 then turned her back around, putting a hand on her waist and back, again with her face on the again managed to turn and told PO2 to please not touch her, she knew her rights, and they were just car. having a discussion. PO2 kept telling to calm down, this was the only thing that PO2 said to her. While was having this interaction with PO2, she looked to the left and saw PO1 and PO3 pick up was trying to get down, her feet were up about a foot in the air. she estimated they picked dangling and she was kicking. The officers walked for about two steps like this and then dragged to the described the officers as dragging police car. each had their hands underneath her armpits. with her legs from the knee to the foot being dragged. While the officers were dragging her, they called her a "nigger" a few times, told her she was "dirty," and called her a "bitch." did not know which of the two officers said what, but heard two different voices. The officers slammed into the car, into the area near the back tire/trunk area and then was placed in the back seat of the car. was not handcuffed during this time and did not see any injuries to her. did not see which officers got into the back seat with her. When being placed in the car, he exchanged words with one of the other officers and walked away PO2 saw from She called out to him, asking what precinct they were from and where was going. PO2 did not turn around and continued toward the car. As the car pulled off, approximately five seconds after was placed in it. heard her screaming, "Someone help me, someone help me!" noted that when the car pulled off, she saw four officers inside of it, even though they had originally only been stopped by three and saw PO2 in the front passenger's seat. She believed the fourth officers had come from the second car that had pulled up and left during the incident. got in car and attempted to follow the officers' car. saw her. eve was swollen to the size of a baby's fist. The next morning, when

- On September 19, 2015, PO Burnett was on duty from 11:15 p.m. until 7:50 a.m. the following day, with overtime until 5:00 p.m., working as the robbery auto with PO Colon, dressed in uniform, and assigned to a marked vehicle, number in which he was the front passenger.

### Memo Book

PO Burnett noted the following entries in his memo book: At 4:05 a.m., 1 car stop front of **the following** for disobey steady red light. Motorist almost hit RMP. Upon stop motorist was acting erratic and refusing to comply with police orders. Motorist had a fist fight with one of her passengers and had to be restrained. Upon check motorist had open warrant. At 4:15 a.m., during transport to 79 PCT, deft. did bite my left forearm and during struggle A/O fractured left hand. At 4:31 a.m., 1 under. At 5:00 a.m., 61 to **the following** Hospital. At 8:00 a.m., returned to 79 PCT.

### **CCRB** Testimony

On December 10, 2015, PO Burnett was interviewed at the CCRB.

On September 19, 2015, at approximately 4:05 a.m., PO Burnett and his partner, PO Colon, were driving through the intersection of when he observed the defendant, known to the run a red light. was driving on investigation as The officers were in the middle of the intersection, driving down and almost hit their RMP. PO Burnett came within a few feet of their vehicle and the red light had been a steady red light. PO estimated that Burnett noted that he knew the light had not just switched because the officers had been proceeding through a steady green light on their side of the intersection. PO Colon also noticed run the red light, the officer did not have any conversation about the infraction. The officers engaged their lights, PO Burnett was not sure if they engaged sirens as well, and went to pull over. They were pulling her over due to the traffic light pulled over right away, however he believed that she was pulling violation. PO Burnett explained that over anyway, regardless of the police lights. When the officers turned the corner on to was already pulled over, PO Burnett did not think she had even noticed the police previously. The officers pulled up behind car, which was parked in front of PO Colon and PO Burnett exited their vehicle, PO Colon approached the driver's side of car and PO Burnett approached the passenger's side. In addition to there were other individuals in the car. PO Burnett was not sure how many people were in the car, but recalled that there were individuals in the back seat. Upon approaching the car, PO Burnett stood on the passenger's side, watching the other passengers in the car while None of the passengers were talking to PO Burnett during this time and he did not PO Colon spoke to speak to any of them. PO Burnett was not sure what PO Colon's conversation with consisted of. None of the car's occupants gave PO Burnett an explanation for why they had run the red light and PO Colon did not communicate to him that had provided any kind of reason for this. It was noted to PO Burnett that his memo book entry described as "erratic and refusing to comply." PO Burnett stated that this referred to not wanting to get out of the car for PO Colon. PO Burnett had heard PO Colon ask to exit the car previous to this, PO Burnett estimated that PO Colon asked her to do this a couple of minutes after the initial stop. PO Burnett did not know why PO Colon wanted to step out of the car. PO Burnett stated that usually individuals are asked to step out of their vehicle if the officers feel that they are intoxicated. PO Burnett believed that this was what was going on during incident. PO Burnett did not notice anything that was intoxicated and PO Colon did not communicate anything to him, either during the made him believe incident or at a later point, that he had believed to be intoxicated. Prior to exiting her vehicle, PO Colon had obtained her ID. The ID gave PO Colon was not a driver's license, it was a benefit card. PO Burnett did not know why presented PO Colon with a benefit card instead of a driver's license and PO Colon did not inform him of any details about this. According to PO Burnett, a benefit card is a valid

form of ID to present in terms of identifying oneself, but is not a valid form of ID during a car stop because a driver needs to have a driver's license. Benefit cards have photographs on them. PO Colon had to ask to exit the vehicle twice before she complied. then exited the car and began yelling at one of the passengers in car. PO Burnett explained that this was the behavior that he had been referring to in his memo book as "erratic." Besides yelling at the passenger, there was nothing else that was doing that led PO Burnett to describe her as erratic. Once began screaming, PO Burnett came around to the driver's side of the vehicle. When PO Burnett reached the driver's side, was still screaming. PO Burnett did not see PO Colon do anything to investigate the possibility that was intoxicated, he did not see PO Colon perform a field sobriety test. PO Burnett does not carry a breathalyzer on himself or in his car, and PO Colon does not carry a breathalyzer. PO Burnett was not aware of being breathalyzed at any point during the incident. During this time, all the other occupants of car were inside of her vehicle and were all yelling. PO Burnett did not recall what they were yelling. When PO Burnett came over to the driver's side of the vehicle, PO Colon gave him benefit card and PO Burnett went back to their vehicle to run a warrant check on

PO Burnett estimated he was in the car running the warrant check for two minutes. From this warrant check, PO Burnett became aware that had an open warrant. Prior to realizing had this open warrant, the intention in pulling her over had been to issue her a ticket for running the red light. While PO Burnett was running the warrant check, he became aware that a "fist fight" had broken out between and a passenger from her car. PO Burnett was not sure if this passenger had gotten out of the front or back seat of car, he had not seen the passenger exit the vehicle. When PO Burnett first saw the passenger and became and the passenger were on the ground fighting, PO Burnett could not recall if they aware of the fight. were in the street or sidewalk. They were fighting on ground on the driver's side of the car, PO Burnett could not recall how far from the car they were. Once he witnessed them fighting, PO Burnett exited the vehicle. As he was approaching the fight, PO Burnett informed PO Colon that had a warrant, telling him, "She has a warrant, she's going." PO Burnett and PO Colon broke up the fight, pulling off of the other individual. PO Burnett and PO Colon each grabbed one of arms, PO Burnett could not recall which arm he grabbed. arm by her wrist, he never grabbed any other part of her arm. No officer was PO Burnett grabbed restraining the other individual. PO Burnett explained that no one was restraining the other individual because was the "aggressor" and had been "winning the fight," was on top of the other individual. PO or the other individual. None of the other passengers were Burnett did not observe any injuries on was also the only one restrained because she was going to be placed under arrest, PO outside of the car. Burnett explained that due to open warrant, regardless of the fight she had gotten into, she was going to be arrested.

At some point during the incident, one of the passengers, PO Burnett was not sure which one, had to use the bathroom. This was the only person who mentioned needing to use the bathroom. PO Burnett did not know if this passenger used the bathroom and did not see anyone urinate in the street. PO Burnett was shown as urinating in the street. PO Burnett stated that this "might have" happened, but he "did not remember too much of that, but yea she

could have urinated in the street." PO Burnett stated that this probably occurred when he went back to the car to run the warrant check. He did not see the urination occur, but thought that went off to the side at some point.

Once was pulled up out of the fight, she was not resisting but was yelling at the individual she had been fighting with. PO Burnett could not remember what she was yelling. The individual that was yelling at was yelling back at her. PO Burnett did not place any radio calls in relation to this stop and no other officers came to the scene at any time during the stop. No supervisor ever came to the scene. PO Burnett handcuffed right after the officers had pulled her out of the fight. PO Burnett described reaction to being handcuffed as "fine," she was still yelling at the other individual but was "not really concerned" with the officers. Was placed in the back seat of the RMP. Was compliant with being placed in the RMP, she walked to the vehicle on her own accord. It was never necessary for

along, or dragged to the RMP. PO Burnett was not issuing any commands and was not saying anything to him, but was still yelling at the other individual. continued velling even when she had been placed inside of the RMP, trying to yell out of the window. There were no problems placing in the RMP, she did not resist in any way and it was never necessary for her to pushed up against the car, nor was she ever pushed up against the car. PO Burnett sat in the back seat next to PO Burnett got into the back seat because the vehicle did not have a partition and it is procedure to sit in the back seat when there is not one. PO Burnett was sitting behind the driver's seat and was sitting to his right. After they pulled away from the scene, focus shifted to PO Burnett. She began yelling at him, saying "Why the fuck are you arresting me?" PO Burnett did not respond to in any way and did not issue was not doing anything that necessitated him issuing her her any instructions. PO Burnett noted that a "stupid black bitch" or a "dirty black bitch," and did not refer to her as a instructions. He did not call "nigger" or "faggot," and did not hear any other officers say this. Besides the yelling, was not doing anything that would make PO Burnett fear for his safety, was not resisting in any way, and was not moving her body around. Approximately a minute after pulling away from the scene, bit PO Burnett on his right forearm. bit him, PO Burnett had not had any physical contact with Prior to when Leading up to the bit. had not done anything that signaled to PO Burnett what was going to happen, he stated "next thing I know, there's a mouth on my arm." was biting PO Burnett's arm fairly strongly, it was causing a substantial amount of pain, broke the skin, and there was blood draw. Once started biting him, PO Burnett began doing "everything in his power" to get her off. Besides biting his forearm, was not doing anything else to get at PO Burnett. He pushed her with an open hand on her head, which was at first not effective in getting her off of him. would not get off his arm in response to this motion. PO Burnett did not remember if head was up high or down near his lap area during this time. PO Burnett did not make any head not with an open palm and did not ever punch her at any time. PO Burnett movements towards did not ever come in contact with neck and never grabbed her head, and never wrapped his hand around her head, neck, or any other part of her body. PO Burnett told PO Colon, "She's biting me." In response to this, PO Colon stopped the car short. PO Burnett believed the motion of the car stopping short dislodged from his arm because they both moved forward from this abrupt stop. PO Burnett fell forward, he did not quite fall off the seat but fell forward into the front seat of the car. PO Burnett was not sure if also fell forward, neither of them fell off the seats. PO Burnett was not sure of his hands went into any specific direction at this point. stopped biting him at the point in which the car stopped short. Besides pushing her with an open hand and falling off from the motion of the car, PO Burnett did not have to make any other movements or have any other physical contact with to get her off. PO Burnett did not recall ever striking to get her off of him. PO Burnett estimated that was biting him for a minute. During this minute, besides pushing on her head, PO Burnett was not doing anything else, his hand never went in any other direction or made contact with body. PO Colon did not intervene with the struggle between PO Burnett and any other part of At some point during this time, PO Burnett broke his left hand. PO Burnett was not sure how his hand was broken, he believed during the struggle it "could have hit something." PO Burnett was not sure if he hit it on something on the car. He did not recall a point at which he felt a substantial amount of pain to his hand, he did not feel pain until after the incident was concluded and he was back at the stationhouse. After stopped biting him, the officers continued driving to the stationhouse. tried to bite PO Burnett again on his right forearm, but at this point he was "on guard" and stopped her. He held back with his right hand, pushing was trying to push back in response to this and then spit in PO her away on the shoulder closest to him. Burnett's face. PO Burnett commented that he got blood all over his face as a result of this and believed that had spit his own blood on him. Besides pushing her shoulder, PO Burnett did not have to do anything else to away from him and did not push any other part of her body. PO Burnett did not come in contact keep with her head or her neck during this time.

Once at the precinct stationhouse, the officers then brought to the front desk. Po Burnett did not recall whether he or PO Colon removed from the vehicle. While they were bringing her into the

stationhouse, was spitting at them. At the front desk, PO Burnett realized there was something wrong with his hand, he noticed a huge lump on the side of his hand. PO Burnett stated that his fifth metacarpal had been was taken to the cell area by other officers, PO Burnett did not know who. PO Burnett did not injured. and she was not complaining to him of any injuries, and he did not know if she see any injuries on complained to anyone else of injuries. PO Burnett was aware that was taken to the hospital later, he stated that he guess the desk informed him of this. He did not know why was taken to the hospital but thought it might have been because of the way she was acting, she was "acting crazy," screaming at the stationhouse. PO Burnett and went to different hospitals, he did not remember which hospital she went to. PO Burnett was not sure if there were problems transporting to the hospital and was not sure if she was body bagged or spit masked.

PO Burnett did accessing arrest processing, but did not see her during this time. He noted that "they" (he believed the desk sergeant said this) did not want him and accessing interacting. He did not remember who the desk sergeant was. PO Burnett was shown arrest photo and it was noted that her eye is substantially swollen. PO Burnett did not ever observe any injury similar to this on a swelling on her face, and did not complain of an injury to her eye. During the incident, PO Burnett did not see anything that would have caused an injury like the one in the photo. When PO Burnett was pushing on the head, he was coming in contact with her face but was not sure what specific parts of her face.

On December 10, 2015, PO Colon was interviewed at the CCRB.

On September 19, 2015, at approximately 4:05 a.m., PO Colon was driving down with the officers proceeded straight through the his partner, PO Burnett. At the intersection of intersection, there was a steady green light, when PO Colon saw a car coming towards him in the corner of his eye. The car almost hit the officers' car, coming towards PO Colon's left side and coming close enough that he had to swerve out of the way, and kept going, southbound on PO Burnett noticed this as well. PO Colon heard him say something about the car and PO Colon commented to him, "Let's pull them over." PO Colon made a "sort of a U-turn," turned on his lights, and followed the car, with the intention of pulling it over for disobeying the steady red light. PO Colon was not sure if his sirens were on. Approximately a block away, the officers pulled the PO Colon pulled up behind the vehicle. PO Colon's intention was to obtain vehicle over in front of the driver's license and issue a summons for the red light violation. PO Colon and PO Burnett exited their vehicle and PO Colon approached the driver's side of the car, PO Burnett approached the passenger's side. PO Colon asked the driver, known to the investigation as for her driver's license. told PO Colon that she did not have her driver's license. He asked her for another form of identification and she provided him with a benefit card. A benefit card is acceptable as form of ID, but is not acceptable for proof of driving. A warrant check can be conducted from a benefit card, all that is needed is a name and date of birth, and from that information it can also be looked up whether a person has a valid license. PO Colon gave the benefit card to PO Burnett so that he could run a was very angry at PO Colon for pulling her over, she was yelling and cursing at warrant check with it. him. He tried to explain to her why he had pulled her over, explaining about the red light and that she had almost caused an accident. PO Colon stated that was very aware that she had run a red light, he did not remember what she said about it. Given that had run a red light that had been steady for quite some time and was agitated, PO Colon decided to ask to exit her car so that he could perform a field sobriety test and see if smelled like alcohol.

did not smell like alcohol, was steady on her feet, and her eyes were not bloodshot. PO Colon does not carry a breathalyzer on him and does not know if PO Burnett carries a breathalyzer. Was still upset about being pulled over. PO Colon tried to explain why she had been pulled over. PO Colon did not recall how many passengers were in the vehicle, but the car was full with passengers in the back seat. We and the passengers informed him that they had been at a birthday party and that the passenger had been drinking and was intoxicated. One of the passengers of the car, who had been sitting in the driver's side rear passenger seat, got out of the vehicle and said that she needed to use the bathroom. PO Colon did not remember this passenger actually going to the bathroom. He did not remember if anyone else was talking about using the bathroom. PO Colon did not remember if anyone urinated in the street. They were standing outside waiting for PO Burnett to return from the

running the warrant check, when got into an argument with the passenger that had exited the car. When the argument first began, the two of them were standing next to car, on the driver's side. PO Colon did not recall what the argument between them was about, but eventually, the altercation became physical. PO Colon estimated they were verbally arguing for a minute before the fight became physical. and the passenger began hitting each other, PO Colon did not remember who hit whom first, what parts of their body they were hitting, and the passenger fell to the ground or whether they were hitting each other with an open or closed palm. during the fight, PO Colon was issuing them verbal commands to stop. PO Burnett came out and informed PO Colon that was going to be arrested for an open warrant, PO Colon did not know if he came out in response to the fighting or because he had finished the warrant check. PO Burnett did not inform PO Colon of any problems with having a valid license. The officers broke up the fight, which was occurring on or near the sidewalk. They separated and the passenger and picked up by her arms, PO Colon did not remember "seemed like the aggressor" in the fight. where on her arm they grabbed her, but noted that was handcuffed, she was compliant in being handcuffed, and continued screaming at the passenger. The passenger did not need to be restrained at all. PO Colon did not remember if any other officers came to the scene during the incident. PO Colon did not remember if he placed any radio calls and did not know if PO Burnett placed any calls. was being arrested due to the open warrant and possibly disorderly conduct, PO Colon noted he did not process the arrest so he was not sure. car was legally parked, so the officers left it where it was. Mr. Roberts was brought to the officers' vehicle, which she was compliant with. was not ever lifted upwards, dragged, pushed or placed against the car. was still angry at the passenger she had fought with, still saying things to her. PO Colon did not remember if he was issuing instructions to her and did not refer to as a "stupid black bitch," a "dirty black bitch," or a "nigger," and never heard another officer say this. was placed in the backseat of the officers' vehicle, on the passenger's side. PO Burnett also got into the backseat, driver's side, which is procedure when transporting a prisoner in a vehicle without a partition. Besides being handcuffed, was not restrained in any other way and there was no barrier between her and PO Burnett. There was no one in the passenger's front seat. Inside the car, was still screaming, PO Colon did not remember what she was saving. Less than a minute after PO Colon was driving to the stationhouse, he heard PO Burnett yelling, "She's biting me, she's biting me." PO Colon stopped short on , around the vicinity of , and looked over his right shoulder, and saw biting PO Burnett's arm, PO was biting him on his forearm, she looked like she Colon did not remember which arm she was biting. was bent down. PO Burnett was struggling to get her off. It looked like PO Burnett was trying to push off of him, pushing her with an open hand. Prior to this, PO Colon did not see PO Burnett have any physical contact with Besides the pushing, PO Colon was not sure if he saw PO Burnett make any other arm movements that came in contact with her head or neck. PO Colon did not ever see PO Burnett strike with a closed fist. He did not hear or see anything that was similar to punching. did not ever complain of being punched or PO Burnett having his hand on her neck or having trouble breathing. PO Colon decided it was best to get back to the stationhouse as soon as possible and continued driving. PO Colon estimated that PO Burnett and were struggling from when he stopped till they got back to the precinct, which was roughly a distance of two blocks. PO Burnett did not tell PO Colon any details of the struggle or how he had managed to get her off of him. PO Colon could hear screaming during the struggle, but did not know what she was saving. By the time the officers reached the stationhouse, PO Burnett had managed to get off of him. PO Burnett's forearm had a bite mark on it that appeared to have broken the skin, PO Colon did

not remember if there was any blood. PO Colon did not know how PO Burnett's hand came to be injured and stated that PO Burnett was not sure how it occurred, except during the struggle. Was acting "crazy," screaming and kicking the back of the seat. Besides the bite mark, when the struggle did not injure any other officer. The officers got her out of the RMP and brought her inside the stationhouse. Was still screaming but walked on her own accord to the stationhouse. Was then lodged in the prisoner's cell, PO Colon did not lodge her and did not know who did. That was the end of PO Colon's interaction with her, the last time he saw her was at the front desk, after which he remained inside the precinct for the remainder of his tour. PO Colon noticed some swelling on

face, he did not remember exactly where. We was not complaining of any injuries to PO Colon and he did not know if she complain to anyone else. Later, PO Colon was informed that was taken to the hospital. He did not have any knowledge of the ever being body bagged or spit masked. He did not know what hospital she was taken to and did not recall who informed him of this, or had any knowledge of what she was treated for. EMS was called for PO Burnett's injury shortly after.

PO Colon viewed **accession** arrest photograph. He did not observe any injury similar to what was displayed in the photo. He stated the swelling he had referred to had just seemed to be on the side of her face. He did not see anything during the struggle that would have caused an injury like that and was not informed of anything by PO Burnett that would have caused that.
