

Security footage from the entrance of 1150 Union Street was obtained from NYCHA, but this footage only showed flashing lights in the distance and not individuals or allegations. Therefore, this footage was not used in the disposition of the allegations.



•	With regard to Allegations L , P , Q , R , and S , the subject officers could not be identified because \$87(2)(b) was unable to provide any descriptions of the subject officers beyond saying that some were white, some were Hispanic, and that they looked "very stereotypical." Furthermore, no officers acknowledged committing any of \$87(2)(b) and \$

•	Although \$87(2)(b) alleged that officers pepper sprayed him, \$87(2)(b) confirmed that she was the one who pepper sprayed \$87(2)(b) \$87(2)(g) (06 and 07 Board Review).
•	Although said that the desk sergeant refused to have him transported to the hospital when he complained of general pain, had no visible injuries, was released after approximately 90 minutes later, and did not obtain medical attention on his own until March 17, 2016, six days after the incident, indicating that he had no apparent need to go to the hospital. \$87(2)(9) (08 and 09 Board Review).



PO Laguna did not remember whether \$87(2)(b) or \$87(2)(b) appeared to be injured when he first approached. PO Laguna approached \$87(2)(b) to handcuff him while PO Rios approached \$87(2)(b) PO Laguna told \$87(2)(b) to get on the ground multiple times, but \$87(2)(b) s hands in order to force them behind his back. \$87(2)(b) continued to resist by pulling his arms in front of him. PO Laguna continued to tell \$87(2)(b) to put his hands behind his back, but \$87(2)(b) continued to refuse by saying, "No! Get the fuck off of me!" At one point, PO Laguna and \$87(2)(b) were both struggling against a parked car. During this time, PO Rios was

P.G 203-11 says that officers must use minimum necessary force to overcome resistance and effect an arrest. Whenever possible, officers should make every effort to avoid tactics, such as sitting or standing on a subject's chest, which may result in chest compression, thereby reducing the subject's ability to breathe (16 Board Review).

In <u>Police Department v. Sgt. Gilberto Beltran</u> the Oath Court found that it was not excessive force for an officer to punch an individual in the head after the individual actively resisted arrest while on the ground (20 Board Review).

<u>People v. DeBour</u> says that an officer needs reasonable suspicion to conduct a level three stop and probable cause to search and arrest an individual (21 Board Review).

said that while she was waiting for sar(2)(b) s mother, PO Laguna placed her against a wall and put her in handcuffs. PO Laguna shined a flashlight in her purse, asked what
she had picked up, and where the weapon was. §87(2)(b) said she did not have a weapon and
explained that she picked up \$87(2)(b) s phone, with cracked screen, and put it in her back
pocket. § 87(2)(b) asked the officers if she was under arrest, but they did not respond. PO

Laguna searched around the area for a weapon while another officer stood by her and watched her. PO Laguna came back and asked \$87(2)(b) where she put the weapon. \$87(2)(b) said she had been standing there the whole time and had not moved. \$87(2)(b) was released after she showed PO Laguna \$87(2)(b) s cell phone (07 Board Review).
said that after the incident, \$87(2)(b) told him that PO Laguna put her into handcuffs and stood her against a wall because they thought she picked up a weapon, but she actually picked up \$87(2)(b) s cell phone. PO Laguna asked \$87(2)(b) what happened, but later let her go and did not take her to the stationhouse (09 Board Review).
PO Laguna said that during the earlier scuffle, he observed \$87(2)(b) holding what appeared to be a black firearm. As PO Laguna and PO Rios got out of their RMP, PO Laguna heard something hit the floor and observed \$87(2)(b) pick up a black object and run away. While it was nighttime, the area was lit by streetlights. PO Laguna stopped and handcuffed \$87(2)(b) on his own, because he was not sure whether she had picked up the firearm he had observed. PO Laguna checked \$97(2)(b) s pockets and waist band. PO Laguna did not remember whether he went into \$87(2)(b) s pockets or searched \$87(2)(c) s purse by shining a flashlight into it. As she was being handcuffed, \$87(2)(b) explained to PO Laguna that she had picked up a cell phone. PO Laguna then saw this cell phone in her hand and observed that it was black and had a crack on the screen. PO Laguna therefore believed \$87(2)(b) and released her after approximately two minutes (11 Board Review).
Sgt. Frias generally corroborated PO Laguna's statement. PO Baez corroborated that sar(2)(b) was questioned by officers after sar(2)(b) and sar(2)(b) were transported from the scene, but did not recall her being placed into handcuffs or her bag being searched. PO Rios and PO Duran did not recall sar(2)(b) being stopped or searched by any officer (13-15 Board Review).
